**Rev. Dr John Dupuche,** Parish Priest in the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne

Dr John Dupuche's book, Abhinavagupta: the Kula Ritual as elaborated in chapter 29 of the Tantraloka was published in 2003; Jesus, the Mantra of God, in 2005; Towards a Christian

*Tantra* in 2009. He is chair of the Catholic Interfaith Committee and research officer at Australian Catholic University. He lives in an interfaith household.



Rabbi Jonathan Keren-Black, Rabbi of the Leo Baeck Centre, East Kew, Melbourne

Jonathan has a background in industry and management, and was ordained as a Rabbi from the Leo Baeck College in London in 1988, serving in London for 15 years, during which he

developed a keen interest and involvement in both environmental and interfaith fields, before coming to Melbourne with his family in 2003 to work with the Leo Baeck Congregation in East Kew. In that year he was involved in founding the Jewish Ecological Coalition and the Jewish Christian Muslim Association of Australia, and in 2008 combined these two interests with the formation of GreenFaith Australia. In his spare time he has also designed and built environmental homes in each hemisphere! Jonathan has published *A Judaism for the Twenty-First Century*, and led the Editorial Team that in 2010 produced the new Prayer book that is now being used across Australia, New Zealand and South Africa. He feels it is a religious responsibility to put 'prayer into practice'.



**Swami Paramananda Saraswati,** Hindu Monk, Monk, President of Yo Veda Inc

Swami Paramananda Saraswati is an inspiring and enthusiastic person with many unique qualities, belonging to the lineage of Adi Shankaracharya. Inspired by various Masters and under the

guidance of Swami Anubhavananda who himself is a desciple of Swami Chinmayananda, Swamiji completed a Post Graduate Vedanta course at Sandepany Sadhanalaya, Powai, India . He has dedicated his life for the service of mankind spreading the knowledge of Vedanta in a logical, yet simple and straightforward manner, on various topics like Bhagwad Geeta, Patanjali Yoga Sutras, Pancadasi, Upanishads, etc. For the last 11 years, he has taken many classes in the form of seminars, camps and workshops to benefit all age groups, from children, teenagers and adults alike. He has travelled widely sharing the knowledge through his great sense of humor and fine delivery of practical knowledge. Swamiji also takes annual pilgrimages to India.

Venerable Anna Goldstein was a student of the Tibetan Buddhist master, Venerable Geshe Acharya Thubten Loden, for almost 30 years until

She has also worked extensively in communications and public affairs involving a wide range of social issues including housing, family violence, finance and education and maintains a strong interest in latest communications channels including social media.
