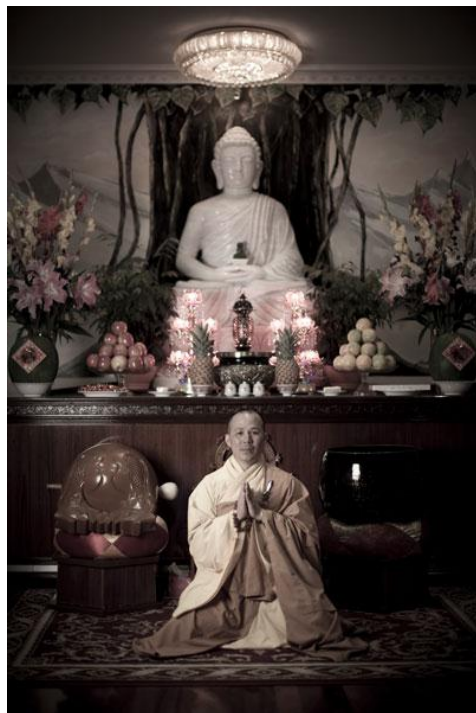
## Information For Artists

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Brimbank City Council is pleased to present the *Faith 2 Faith* Art in Public Spaces Exhibition March 2013. Initiative federally funded by the Department of Immigration and Citizenship (DIAC).

*Faith 2 Faith* Art in Public Spaces Exhibition March 2013 is an event that exhibits the artwork of professional and non-professional artists who live, study, work or play in the municipalities of Brimbank.

The theme *Faith 2 Faith* will include artworks that express the features, benefits and challenges of interfaith dialogue. Interfaith dialogue is the interaction and communication between diverse religious/ spiritual groups and diverse cultural groups. The aim of *Faith 2 Faith* Art in Public Spaces Exhibition March 2013 is to encourage people to address racism and intolerance through the understanding and acceptance of diverse values and beliefs.

Artists may submit work that addresses these themes in the form of visual media which may include painting, drawing, print making, sculpture, photography, text, sound and/or video art to be displayed in Sunshine Art Spaces Gallery and The Granary Café over March 2013 (inclusive of Cultural Diversity Week and Harmony Day).

In addition to the Gallery Exhibition thirty individual artworks will be selected for printing on to A1 posters to be displayed in public spaces in Sunshine, St Albans and Watergardens in March. Artists selected will be required to submit their work for professional photography before **Wednesday 28 November 2012.**

Artists will not be paid to create work but will have the opportunity to sell their works included in the exhibitions.

## How To Register Artwork

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### Artist Registrations Open Wednesday 22 August 2012

To register, the artist is required to complete all fields of the Artist Registration form and provide one image in Tiff or Jpeg format of the work you are proposing to submit.

## Selection Process

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All applications will be reviewed and selected by the *Faith 2 Faith* Hanging Committee which includes two members of Brimbank City Council. All artworks will be selected according to the artworks ability to adequately address and convey the theme of interfaith dialogue.

## Criteria for selection of work

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Works included in the exhibition will be selected subject to:

- The number of works submitted for selection
- Displaying a range of media in the exhibition
- Quality of art work
- Subject matter addressing theme in a creative way

## Notice of Acceptance

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Upon receiving a notice of acceptance the artist will be required to:

1. If requested, arrange to drop off artwork for professional photography prior to **Wednesday 28 November 2012** and arrange collection as advised by council.
2. Attend an artist networking meeting that will be scheduled end of January or early February. This meeting is to ensure clarity of process, information and planning. This meeting most importantly will provide the opportunity to network with the other artists involved.
3. Offer assistance with staffing gallery space over the month of March to ensure regular opening times.
4. Price their artwork, if selected for the gallery space. Council is unable to advise of how much an artist should price their artworks however, an artist may wish to discuss this with other artists at the networking meeting.
5. Brimbank City Council will not handle any money on behalf of artist and potential buyer. Negotiations will be between the buyer and the artist.
6. Installing the exhibition will primarily be the responsibility of the artist, where possible council may be able to provide assistance.



7. Brimbank City Council will not cover costs of artists' materials, framing or artists' fees.
8. Brimbank City Council is not liable for theft or damage to artworks during the exhibition, installation or transport of artworks.
9. Drop off, install and pick up artwork upon the request of Brimbank City Council.
10. Agree to participate in media and promotion activities relating to the *Faith 2 Faith* Art in Public Spaces Exhibition.
